We slightly exceeded that goal, raising a total of \$7035.** God always supplies what is needed for our children as you give generously to meet their personal and educational needs. **We are also pleased to report that 10 of our 11 Class Ten students passed their Manipur State Board exams in June. Six students passed in Division 1 and three students passed in Division 2.** The student who did not pass is repeating Class 10 and will retake the Board exams next year. Graduating from Class 10 in India and Nepal is equivalent to graduating from high school in America. All ten of the students who passed their Board exams are going on to attend Classes 11 and 12, which are college preparatory grades. So it looks like we will have a large contingent of students beginning college in 2021. To God be the glory as these children realize their full potential in Christ Jesus!
