Joel was born out of wedlock. His father abandoned him and his mother escaped from her home fearing her parents and society. She was sheltered by a Christian woman until Joel was born. The woman brought Joel to the Mercy Children's Home when he was only 2 1/2 years old. Recently he returned to his native village during a school break. Here is his reflection on his visit:

Joel - Mercy Children's Home, Nepal



"Overall, it was a good experience to go back to my village. I stayed at a relative's house. One afternoon, my grandfather came to see me. I was surprised that he came all the way to see me. What surprised me more was the reason for his visit. He asked me to write an official application letter. He said, "Joel, I heard you go to an English-speaking school. No one in the village has studied as much as you. No one understands or can read or write in English. Could you kindly write this application letter for me?" He has such high regard for me and I am only a Grade 10 student. I was speechless. With my limited knowledge, I wrote the application for him. He returned home happily. Right after he left, something struck my mind. I realized the importance of education. I am grateful for all that my parents (Pastor Janga and Mercy) have done to bring me where I am today. My father kept on stressing, and sometimes scolded us when we would fail in our

exams, when we would neglect studying. I am beginning to see the significance in his words. I am also grateful to my sponsors, whose prayers, love and support helped me in my education thus far. The incident in the village has left a huge impact on my life. After I complete my education, I want go back to my village and start a school. I could be the principal maybe? I hope and pray that God will make this dream of mine come true. Kindly keep me in your prayers as I write my 10th board exam in the Spring. To be honest, I am only an average student. However, my dreams are big because my God is big. In Him, nothing is impossible! – Joel
