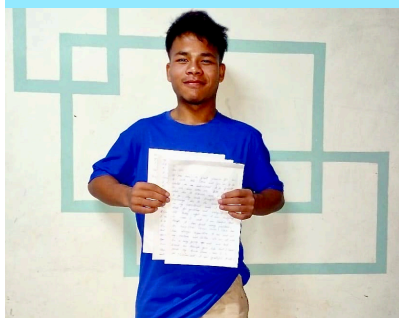


From Our President...

UPDATE FROM PASTOR LESLY

Conditions in Haiti are deteriorating. We are surviving instead of living. The war is worsening between the Haiti people, the government and the armed gangs that have been ruling the country. There are continuous riots, blocked roads, lack of diesel and gasoline, and inflation has driven up the price of food. All schools are closed, foreign embassies are on lockdown, not much clean water, no lights. Even hospitals are shut down. The people are demanding that the Prime Minister resign, and rioting will continue until he steps down. My family is still living in the mountains of Mirebalais with the boys. Schools were supposed to reopen on September 5th, but they remain closed. The boys go to church, attend youth programs during the week and play soccer with the community. Haiti is broken. Please join with us to pray for good change in Haiti, for peace and open doors for our orphanage home and God's continuing grace, mercy, protection and blessings.
