Our children have returned to school after enjoying their Christmas Break. Many thanks for the donations to our Education Fund through our matching pledge campaign. So far we have raised \$18,540. It's not too late to help us reach our goal of \$25,000. Every year the cost of our kids' education rises, making it a challenge to raise what is needed. Thankfully, admission fees for our Class 11 and 12 students aren't due until May, so there is still time to cover what is needed.

Using donations from our Christmas Fund, construction of a separate latrine for our girls at the Bethel Children's Home will begin this Spring. We also sent \$500 from our General Fund to Bethel last month to repair their vehicle. Unfortunately, it still needs more repair work to run properly. A new vehicle is needed for the long term (cost is \$14,000).

He watched over us, protected us, and took care of us. Since January 9th, the children have returned to school. Eight of our boys go to school in the city, which is 2 km from where we live. We make 2 trips on our motorbike - 4 boys at a time. We're praying for \$7000 to buy a pick-up truck to safely transport the boys to and from school."
